



How can we make society more resilient to outbreaks?

Professor Troy Tassier explodes the myth that epidemics are a 'great leveller' and exposes how pandemics deepen societal divides throughout history.

In 2020, the poor and marginalized across the world were thrust onto the front lines of the war with COVID-19. Minority populations in both the US and UK were struck down by the virus at rates greatly exceeding their representation in the population. These same groups faced increased economic hardships as well.

From the Black Death to the great influenza in 1918, epidemics systematically intensify and inflate the inequality present in society. The reasons for this disparity are hidden in plain sight. Unequal access to healthcare and overcrowding in cities are only part of the story. Looking at the historical context of previous epidemics together with insights gleaned from the fields of economics, epidemiology, and social network analysis, Professor Tassier uses a light touch to explain the origins of this inequity and how it is more deeply rooted in our societies than ever previously understood or reported in the media.

In his long career, he has been South East Asia Correspondent for The Observer, Hong Kong Correspondent for The Guardian, Foreign Correspondent for The Independent, Chief Editor of the Eastern Express, and a regular contributor to Fortune, Wall Street Journal Asia, The Daily Telegraph, ABC (Australia), Deutsche Welle and Radio Vaticana. He has won Human Rights Press awards several times including receiving a Certificate of Special Merit for commentary in 2021. He now resides in St. Albans.



But Mina's career isn't all that's at stake when a Heifer is accused of poisoning their breast milk—now a capital offense amidst the famine—which threatens MLM's entire operation.

At the same time, Mina is plagued by anonymous, hateful text messages that ratchet up to stalking, making her fear for her life. Could the messages be from the Incel Army who hate the Heifers or is the danger closer to home? While Mina investigates the mounting threats against LactCon and her fellow Heifers, she uncovers a sinister plot to reverse the impact of the global famine.

Mina will need to decide what she values more: her career or her autonomy, and her choice will affect women everywhere.
